Asanga Tilakaratne

Professor (Emeritus) Asanga Tilakaratne is a distinguished scholar of Buddhism, specializing in Theravada Buddhism and served as a Emeritus Professor of the Department of Buddhist Studies at the University of Colombo. He contributed extensively to Buddhist studies through his writings, including *Nirvana and Ineffability* and *Theravada Buddhism: The View of the Elders*. A former director of the Postgraduate Institute of Pali and Buddhist Studies, University of Kelaniya his work bridges academic rigor and traditional Buddhist thought, influencing scholars worldwide. Currently Tilakaratne serves as the Dean of the Faculty of Postgraduate Studies at Nagananda International Institute of Buddhist Studies, Kelaniya.

Dr C. D. Sebastian is Professor of Indian Philosophy at Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Bombay, Mumbai.
