Guidelines

1) Abstract

- Should include research purpose, methodology, major findings in brief and conclusion
- Font size 10/ single spaced/ Times New Roman/ in italics
- Should be between 250 – 300 words
- Maximum of five key words, arranged in the alphabetical order, below the abstract

2) Body of the text (Introduction, Discussion & Conclusion)

- Introduction should include background of the study, research problem and question(s), Objectives, Scope and limitations, Significance, literature review
- Discussion under suitable sub-headings
- Conclusion (Summarize findings, reflect on the implications, and suggest areas for further research)
- Titles and paragraphs should not be indented
- Reference style: APA

3) General Format

- Title (less than 50 characters). Bold faced, font size 14
- Name/s and affiliation/s of author/s.
- e-mail address and contact numbers of the corresponding author/s.
- MS Word 2016 or above
- Page numbering: bottom, right, in Arabic numerals
- Font: Times New Roman Size 12 / Justified
- Subtopics: Times New Roman Size 12, boldfaced, left aligned
- Language: English

NOTE: Identify the corresponding author by placing an asterisk after the name.

4) Format for typesetting

- Paper size: A4 (210 X 297 mm)
- Margins: Top, bottom and right margins of 25 mm and a left margin of 30 mm
- Line spacing: 1.5 (18 points) throughout the text
- Length of the manuscript including text, tables, figures and references should not exceed 4000 words (3000-4000 is fine).

5) Tables and figures

- Should be included within the text
- Tables should be numbered sequentially using Arabic numerals. The titles should be self-explanatory. Figures should be numbered sequentially using Arabic numbers and be accompanied by a self-explanatory caption, left aligned. Titles of both Tables and figures should be of not more than 10 words.
- Illustrations, line drawings and photographs, if any, should be clear, properly numbered and captioned and ready for reproduction (editable format).
- All lettering, graph lines, and points on graphs should be sufficiently large to permit reproduction.
- Lines of maps, artwork, and illustrations should be of appropriate thickness. Please note that thin lines do not reproduce well.

6) Acronyms and abbreviations:

All acronyms/ abbreviations should be written in full at the first appearance.
