The Process: The Beach Cleanup Project was carried out with the necessary approvals from the Panadura Municipal Council and the Public Health Inspector (PHI). Under the guidance of the PHI, we categorised the collected waste into four groups: plastics and polythene, biodegradable items, beer cans, and glass. To maximize efficiency, volunteers were divided into two groups, starting from opposite ends of the beach and working towards the middle.
