Sociology is a relatively new social science based on a strong European philosophical foundation. It is an academic discipline that takes a critical approach to the study of human relationships within society and its various institutions; thus its teachings can be applied to many fields or career paths. Due to the multiple benefits Sociology graduates gain in knowledge and critical thinking, the study of Sociology has rapidly gained popularity among undergraduate and post-graduate students. Since the inception of the Department of Sociology of the University of Colombo in 1969; the department has emerged as a center of excellence producing graduates of outstanding stature.

Offering both undergraduate and post-graduate degree programmes the graduates of the Department of Sociology have gone on to serve in numerous public and private sector entities both local and international. Forty years into the history of the Department, a few graduates and staff felt a need to create a platform on which both parties could come together to ensure that the ties formed during university days continue to flourish and nurture the department in future. To this end in 2009 the Sociology Alumni Association of the University of Colombo (SAAUC) was established spearheaded by the encouragement of the incumbent Head of the Department, Prof Subhangi Herath.

The alumni association was formed to achieve several objectives: First to promote fellowship among its members while harnessing their professional, social and educational interests; second, to form a bridge among the academic staff, alumni, current students and post-graduate students with a view to developing the Department of Sociology; third, the association aims to develop and support regional alumni and expand their participation and support in alumni affairs.

Seminar series on 'Sociological Perspective on COVID 19'

The Covid-19 pandemic presents the profoundest crisis of our times. The seemingly impossible happened: borders have closed, nations have locked down and individuals have physically and socially been isolated for the collective good. At present we find ourselves tangled in an unprecedented predicament. Therefore the SAAUC decided to organize an online webinar series on 'Everyday life in an uncertainty' and Covid 19 Pandemic and Social Responsibility: Lesson Learnt, Vision for the future and the Role of Sociologists.

There were two online sessions which were held on 19th April and 6th May, 2020 with speakers from academia and non-academia in partnership with TIIKM, the organizing body of the two events.

The two webinars focused on the daily life of people during Covid 19. All the speakers provided a broad sociological knowledge of Covid-19 with special attention to the challenges presented during a pandemic and how best one should face it.

Sociologists are well equipped with the knowledge and discipline to understand how the effects of a pandemic can infiltrate and change lives. In the webinars presented by the SAAUC Ulrich Beck's conceptualisation of risk society as 'a new social condition, was highlighted and the concept of 'new normal' was also focused with a sociological point of view.

Distribution of 'Face Masks'

Wearing face masks is one of the essential means to prevent the transmission of certain respiratory diseases such as the coronavirus disease 2019(COVID-19).

Countries increasingly require masks in closed public spaces. However, purchasing masks presented a challenge to some people; recognizing this issue the SAAUC initiated a project of distributing face masks for Sociology undergraduates from the 1st to 4th years.

Ms. Malraji Wanniarachchi a past President of the SAAUC personally donated 500 face masks. One student received three face masks.

Furthermore, face masks were distributed to the Children's Unit of the 'Apeksha' hospital on 12th September 2020 an initiative executed by the donations of the executive committee.

The book is based on a story of a girl child who has a talking difficulty. This book critically opens up a dialogue regarding people with disabilities while also inviting a sociological and social work approach to disability studies.

The need to motivate students during the Covid 19 pandemic was raised in the committee, to this end the SAAUC organised a webinar with prominent Sociologists

This programme aimed at highlighting the value of a discipline like Sociology to understand and deal with uncertain times. All panelists were members of the department and the aim of this programme was to highlight what Sociologists are capable of executing in different fields.
